Hanna Levy-Hass Bergen-Belsen [bɛʁɡənˌbɛlsən], or Belsen, was a Nazi concentration camp in what is today Lower Saxony in northern Germany, southwest of the town of Bergen near Celle. The first commandant of Bergen –Belsen was SS- Obersturmbannführer Adolf Haas, who was killed in action on 31 March 1945, he was succeeded by SS-Hauptsturmführer Josef Kramer who had served in a number of concentration camps including Dachau, Mauthausen, and was Commandant in Birkenau and Natzweiler. Bergen-Belsen, also called Belsen, Nazi German concentration camp near the villages of Bergen and Belsen, about 10 miles (16 km) northwest of Celle, Germany.
