I shall be grateful to you if you will cable me whether it meets with your general approval.1. Wilson picked only democrats to go to Versailles with him, and the Congress was now a majority of Republican, so they felt unrepresented. 2. They did not want to be dragged into other countries' wars by the 14th Point, to lose lives, resources and money, when all they wanted was to go isolationist again.3. Free trade amongst all Nations 13. Poland's Independence 2. Freedom of the Seas 10. Division of Austria-Hungary. All military personnel are evacuated from Romania, Serbia, and Montenegro. The individual Balkan StatesThe Fourteen Points was a statement of principles for peace that was to be used for peace negotiations in order to end World War I. The principles were outlined in a January 8, 1918 speech on war aims and peace terms to the United States Congress by President Woodrow Wilson.
