Though this story is about Khadra, a Syrian-American Muslim who grows up in Indiana in the 1970s and 80s, it's really the story of finding a balance between your parents' beliefs and histories and your own. This could be the story of almost any child of immigrants, with slight modifications for culture and religion. Girl in the Tangerine Scarf is a novel, and, as such, is fictional. It is set mostly in Indianapolis, against "recent" historical events. The author is a Syrian Muslim immigrant, now a professor at a US university. I'm guessing that at least some of the details are based on what she, and others she knows, experienced in growing into young adulthood in the US.
